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## OUR PROJECT AND OUR MISSIONS

KEPCHILDREN is NGO an established in the city of Kep, in southern Cambodia, since 2012. Our goal is to provide simplified access to education for the most underprivileged children in the city by combating poverty and quiding them towards appropriate educational path. The objective is to ensure them, in the stable long term. а more professional future.

To achieve this. offer we comprehensive support and care for children and their families, taking into account all their **needs**. We are aware that a child who is malnourished, sick, or precarious housing living in conditions would not be able to fully benefit from what the school has to offer.

#### Our actions are as follows:



We provide each student:

- the necessary school supplies for the year
- two uniforms and two pairs of shoes

And we offer **support classes** in Khmer, mathematics, and English, in addition to public school..



Coverage of **healthcare coast** for the whole family and an **annual dental check-up**.



Donation of **bicycles** for all primary school students and school **pickup service in tuk-tuks** for kindergarten students to ensure that everyone can get to school. For high school students, we also contribute to the financing of a **motorcycle** as the high school is located 10km from the town.



**Social support adapted** to generally improve the living conditions of families according to their needs.



We distribute **10 kg of rice per child every month**. We also provide **daily meals** for kindergarten students and bi-weekly meals for all students.



## OUR ACTION PRINCIPLES



#### DO TOGETHER

In the support provided to families within the association, **any form of handout is avoided**. The aim is not to do things "for" families, but rather "with" them. It is essential that the families we support adhere to these values and are motivated by them.



#### CASE-BY-CASE ASSISTANCE

KEPCHILDREN provides **personalized support** tailored to the specific situation of each child and family, ensuring that all beneficiaries feel acknowledged and supported in their progress.



#### TAKING CHARGE OF YOUR FUTURE

At KEPCHILDREN, our commitment is to provide every child we welcome with the opportunity to choose their future career path and the lifestyle they wish to pursue. Our goal is to promote the independence of families and children by empowering them to take control of their lives.



# RETROSPECTIVE OF THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR IN FIGURE


KEPCHILDREN supported **27 families and 66 children** during the 2023 - 2024 years.

Here is an overview of the distribution of our students by age, grade level, and gender.


Out of a total of 66 students, **36** are girls and **30** are boys. The graphs below provide an overview of the children according to their grade level, age, and gender.

These statistical data by gender reflect our commitment to ensuring access to education for all. However, we can observe a decrease in enrollment, especially among males, in the upper grades. This observation is consistent with the national trend where only 20% of students of high school age actually attend.

#### FINANCIAL TRANSPARENCY

Ensuring the legitimacy of an action requires full transparency regarding its operation, especially at the financial level. Therefore, KEPCHILDREN publishes a comprehensive annual activity report along with a financial report detailing the origin and use of its resources.


Here is a summary of our accounts for the year 2023-2024. Details can be found in our financial report.

Our collective sponsorship system allows us to support the education of a larger number of children without creating inequalities. This year, we have secured **40 sponsorships.** 



In 2024, we managed to raise **€65,013** through sponsorships, donations, partnerships, and various sales and collections, a 2% increase on the previous year. Our expenses in Cambodia and France amounted to **€51,510**.

In 2023, the association's treasury was very low and unable to cover unforeseen expenses. As a result, we decided to revise the operating budget downwards in 2024, keeping only essential expenses which enabled us to make savings and increase our treasury.



## SUCCESSFUL DIGITAL CAMPAINGS

#### 2024: "Operation Christmas" at KEPCHILDREN



This year, we have renewed "Operation Christmas", allowing our donors to choose from a variety of gift kits to support KEPCHILDREN students over the festive season.

#### The kits on offer were as follows:

- Dental Health kit: covers the cost of a visit to the dentist and provides children with oral hygiene products to encourage good habits.
- **School Kit:** provides all essential school equipment for the year 2025, including uniforms, supplies and shoes.
- **Rice Kit:** provides a monthly distribution of 10 kilos of rice throughout the year, guaranteeing a basic diet for pupils.
- Sponsorship kit: provides a complete schooling package, including school supplies, uniforms, shoes, transport and 10 kg of rice per child, all year round.

Thanks to this initiative, we raised a total of €2,505, representing 62 kits offered in the fields of dental health, education and food.

A huge thank you to our donors for their invaluable support, which makes these actions possible!



This year, 66 children were supported by KEPCHILDREN. Here's an overview of our activities and projects.

## **01.** Schooling support

- Material Support: Every semester, we have provided our students the necessary materials for studying and attending school: backpacks, school supplies, uniforms, and shoes. Thanks to the donations received, we have also been able to regularly offer new clothes and hygiene kits to the students and their families.
- Academic Support: Every day, our students from CP to 3e attend support classes in Khmer and mathematics. These daily classes enable them to consolidate what they have learnt alongside public school. They are essential, as 77% of our students have no school support at home. Every Sunday, our English teacher also offers lessons to our students to help them develop their English skills. Last but not least, we have continued to offer financial assistance to families to cover the cost of compulsory extra tuition at the public school.





#### **Review**

The continuation of this academic support and all of our efforts in favor of education has borne fruit, as we have observed an **increase in school** attendance and student engagement in their studies. A survey has shown that 95% of students wish to continue their education at least until high school graduation, and 61% aspire to pursue higher education.

### **02.** Kindergarten and day-care center

#### Welcoming kindergarten students: a busy day

This year, we are taking care of **7 kindergarten students** in our premises every morning from Monday to Friday. This welcoming allows families to continue their professional activities peacefully while offering children playful awakening from a very young age.

So, every morning, our tuk-tuk driver Pu-Mao goes to the students' homes to pick them up and take them to KEPCHILDREN. Under the supervision of our facilitator Soteareak, the kindergartners enjoy **playful and creative activities** throughout the morning, have time for **showering** and **brushing teeth**, a **meal, and a snack** before falling asleep for a nap. Then, the students are taken to the kindergarten of our partner Educating Smiling Children for the afternoon where they receive an introduction to Khmer. After this busy day, they are finally brought back home by Pu-Mao!

#### Day-care center opens in the afternoon!

Since this year, KEPCHILDREN has been offering a day-care center for pupils from CP to CM2 with our activity leader Sotheareaksmey. This new service meets a need: some pupils only have school in the morning, and have free time in the afternoon.

On the program: varied educational activities, playtime, reading sessions in the library, shower sessions, care of minor injuries.... This new program is in addition to the tutoring classes that students take after this games and activities session.









### **03.** Social support


To accomplish our mission in favor of education, we prioritize social work as close as possible to families and their needs. Building strong relationships with families is crucial to best support students in their schooling. Every month, we organize collective and individual meetings. These meetings allow us to address any difficulties encountered and to find solutions together. If necessary, we visit families at their homes to discuss any social, health, or educational challenges they may be encounter in order to provide them with the best possible support.

Additionally, we conducted our **annual social survey**. This survey enabled us to calculate the family income for each household and to assess their overall situation and any changes.

This work was carried out by Sony, our social worker who has been with us this year, and Srey Nay Horn, our director.

Here is a statistical overview of the main difficulties our families encounter, and for which KEPCHILDREN works tirelessly to address:

## **04.** Fooding support

Before joining KEPCHILDREN, many children were forced to work to help their families, often prioritizing work over schooling. Our work involves supporting families so that every child can go to school without this causing a loss of income for the families.

To achieve this, KEPCHILDREN provides families with a monthly distribution of 10 kilograms of rice per child, encouraging families to prioritize education. Through the implementation of the "Canteen for All" project, this assistance is supplemented by two free meals per week for all students in the association, and a daily meal for kindergarten students.

A varied and balanced nutrition is crucial for good health and optimal concentration in class, which is why the canteen and food assistance to families are among our **top expenditure items.** 

This assistance is occasionally supplemented by various food baskets depending on the donations received by KEPCHILDREN.

## **05.** Health support

In Cambodia, despite a rapidly expanding healthcare offer, access to healthcare remains marginal for many families in precarious situations. KEPCHILDREN puts health care at the heart of its programs to improve families' overall quality of life.

#### Reimbursement of healthcare costs

We participate in financing the healthcare expenses of all children, their families, and our employees, totaling **109 beneficiaries** for this program. We fully cover the healthcare expenses of our students and reimburse families up to 50% of their expenses.

#### Dental care

All our students also attended their **annual dental check-up.** Thanks to our partner the Buddhist Library Cambodia Project dental center, this visit enabled us to monitor the students' dental health and provide them with the necessary care.

The meeting was also an opportunity for the dental center's professionals to run an **awareness-raising workshop** for our students on the importance of dental hygiene and good eating habits.

#### Material aid for health

Throughout the year, we provide our students with the necessary hygiene items: soaps, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoos, etc. This assistance is made possible thanks to the donations we receive at KEPCHILDREN.

#### Specific health care

Three of our students require specialized annual care at clinics located in Phnom Penh and Takeo. We have covered the costs of these treatments and supported them throughout these procedures.







### **06.** Socio-cultural support

Throughout the year, we offer our students a range of socio-cultural activities. From setting up **educational workshops** to organizing **extracurricular outings**, our goal is to provide students with exposure to the outside world. We aim to offer them a rewarding experience that goes beyond their school or family routine.

#### **Workshops and Educational Projects:**

- Raising awareness of disability with the NGO Damnok Toek, followed by a day of playful exchange between our two audiences.
- Organization of an **environmental awareness workshop**, including a beach clean-up with our students.
- Workshop to raise awareness of the dangers of excessive sugar consumption and the importance of a balanced diet.
- **Film** evenings throughout the year to help children develop their cinematic culture.
- Open discussions with teenagers on respect for intimacy, understanding their bodies and consent, accompanied by interactive activities.









### **06.** Socio-cultural support

#### **Outings and Extracurricular Activities:**

- River Park Kampot activity area welcomed our teenagers for a day so they could enjoy their facilities: water inflatables, boat rides, slide, etc.
- Our kindergarten students visited the butterfly farm and Wat Samathi Pagoda in Kep.
- We also offered various outings to the pool and beach for our students throughout the year.
- Our students enjoy boxing classes every Sunday thanks to our partner, Sourires de Kep.
- The Social and Educational Center (formerly MCS) allows some of our students to attend their Apsara dance classes on Saturdays. In return, some of their students come to attend our boxing classes.









## **Coming in 2025...**

#### Short term:

- To fight against voluntourism, we continue to work with volunteers over long periods. In 2025, we are renewing the contract of Morgane L., a Service Civique volunteer in 2024 who is pursuing a one-year mission as a Volontariat de Solidarité Internationale. We will also be welcoming Morgane V., a Service Civique volunteer, for 12 months, to lend her a helping hand.
- Continue our actions and projects begun this year.
- Continue to organize extra-curricular outings and special days for children.
- Accelerate the professionalization of our team in Kep by offering them more training and the means to be autonomous and fully involved in our actions.

#### Long term:

- Strengthen and consolidate our funding base to ensure the sustainability of our projects and programs.
- Develop and intensify our partnerships.
- Help our teenagers interested in pursuing their university studies by supporting them financially.
- Continue the schooling of our students for the current school year and beyond, with the aim of finding a sponsor for each child to ensure their long-term education.
- Find the necessary funds to buy a plot of land and build our premises, in order to perpetuate KEPCHILDREN and get out of the precarious situation of renting every 3 to 5 years. This will enable us to develop long-term projects for our association. (Land price: \$250,000).
