This activity report reflects the progress achieved, as well as the challenges that still lie ahead. It reminds us that every contribution matters and that it is together that we can continue to build a fairer, more supportive future filled with hope for the children we support.

KEPCHILDREN OVERVIEW

Since 2012, in Kep in southern Cambodia, KEPCHILDREN has been working to facilitate access to education for the most disadvantaged children. The aim is to reduce social inequalities as much as possible, improve their living conditions, and support them through to their professional integration.

Our support also includes holistic assistance for families. We ensure that children's basic needs are met, as a child who is healthy, well-nourished, and living in adequate housing is better prepared to succeed at school.

Our activities are as follows:



We provide each student with **the necessary school supplies for the year**, distributed in two installments, as well as two uniforms and two pairs of shoes. In parallel with public schooling, tutoring classes are offered in Khmer, mathematics, and English.



All healthcare costs are covered for all children, including an annual dental check-up. We also support and fund the medical care of children with specific needs.



We provide bicycles to primary school students for their commute to school, and for younger kindergarten children, we organize **tuk-tuk transportation**. High school students, whose school is located 10 km from the town, also receive support **to help finance a motorbike**.



To support families in their daily lives, **tailored social follow-up is provided**, including home visits and monthly appointments.



We provide food support through the monthly distribution of **10 kg of rice per child**. We also offer **a daily canteen** for kindergarten pupils and a twice-weekly canteen for all students.

OUR GUIDING PRINCIPLES



WORKING TOGETHER

In our work with the families supported by the association, **we avoid any form of assistance that fosters dependency.** Our goal is not to do things on behalf of families, but to work alongside them. It is essential that the families we support share and are committed to these values.

INDIVIDUALIZED SUPPORT

KEPCHILDREN offers **individualized support** based on the unique situation of each child and family, ensuring that all beneficiaries receive the attention and guidance they need to thrive and make meaningful progress.



SHAPING ONE'S OWN FUTURE

At KEPCHILDREN, we are committed to giving every child in our care the opportunity to choose their future career path and the kind of life they wish to lead. Our goal is to **foster the independence** of children and their families **by providing them with the tools and opportunities to take control of their lives** and shape their own future.



KEY FIGURES REVIEW

During 2025, KEPCHILDREN provided support to **29 families** and **64 children**. Among them, 34 were girls and 30 were boys, reflecting our commitment to ensuring **equitable access to education**.

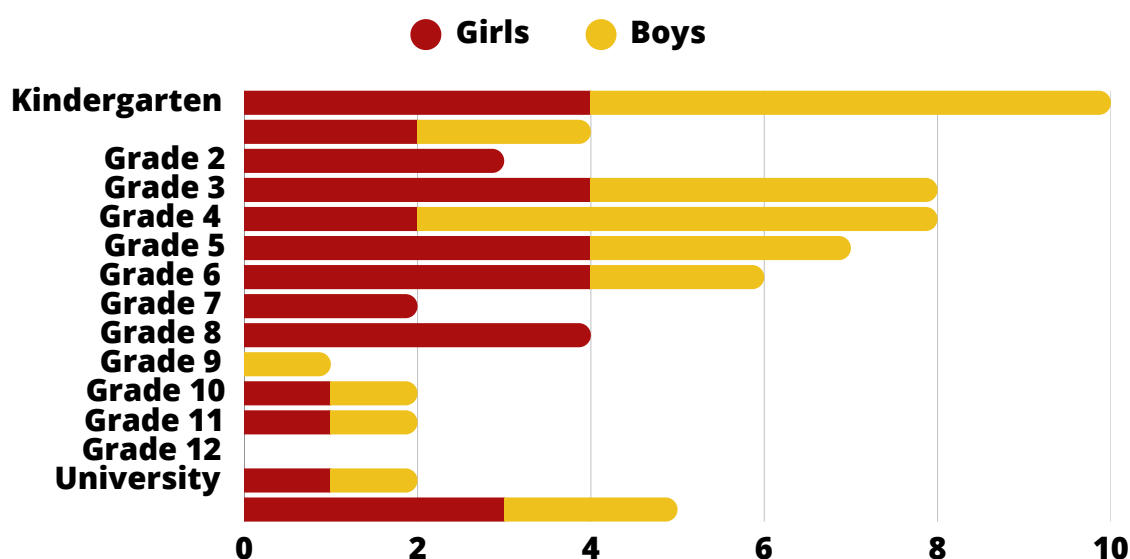
As shown in the chart below, there are relatively **few students beyond Grade 8** (equivalent to the ninth year of schooling). This reflects the fact that several of our adolescents discontinued their education between 2023 and 2025.

This situation can be attributed to a variety of factors, including accumulated learning gaps, financial difficulties, the need to work and contribute to household income, lack of motivation, or a limited awareness of the opportunities that education can provide.

In Cambodia, a significant proportion of young people leave school between Grades 7 and 9, highlighting a broader **national challenge in both access to and retention in education**.

In response to this situation, **we are strengthening our support for adolescents as they transition toward vocational training and employment**. In particular, through our partnership with BSDA, we aim to provide practical alternatives for young people who leave the traditional education system.

FINANCIAL TRANSPARENCY

To uphold the integrity of its mission, KEPCHILDREN is committed to full transparency in the management of its resources. Every year, we publish a comprehensive activity report and a financial report detailing the origin of our funds and their use.

The summary below provides an overview of our accounts for 2025. Detailed financial information can be found in our financial report.

Our collective sponsorship model enables us to cover the educational expenses of the children supported by the association. This year, we were able to rely on the support of **42 sponsorships**.

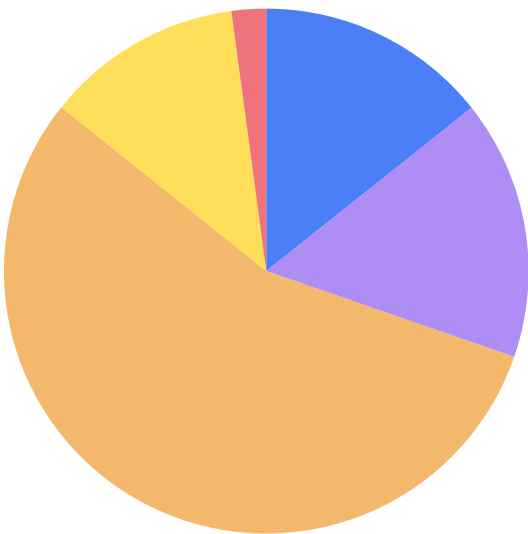

In 2025, we raised **€52,844.37** in France through sponsorships, donations, partnerships, as well as various fundraising events and charity sales, representing a decrease of 18.7% compared with the previous year. This decline was mainly due to a reduction in one-off donations.

Our expenditures related to our activities in Cambodia and France amounted to **€59,039.14**, an increase of 14% compared with the previous year. This rise is primarily attributable to the reinstatement of certain forms of assistance that had been suspended in 2024.

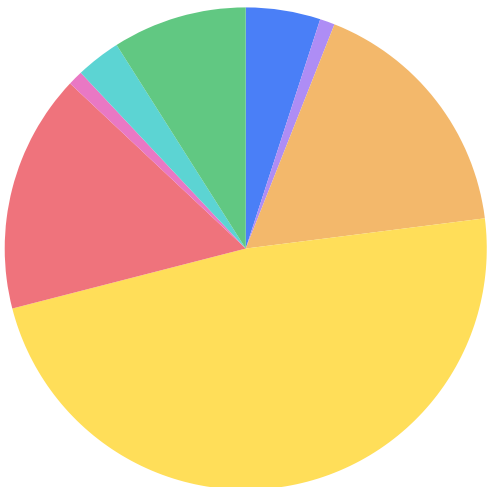

Since 2019, **Karin has been an active supporter of KEPCHILDREN.** She organizes numerous fundraising events. In 2025, her initiatives generated CHF 4,500 in donations. We would like to express our sincere gratitude for her dedication and invaluable support.

OUR ACTIVITIES

This year, 64 children were supported by KEPCHILDREN. Below is a general overview of our activities and the projects carried out.

01. Education

- **Material support:** Every semester, we provide our students with all the materials they need for school and to attend classes: backpacks, stationery, uniforms, and shoes. The donations we receive also enable us to regularly provide new clothing and hygiene kits to the students as well as their families.
- **Tutoring:** From Monday to Friday, our students from first grade through lower secondary school receive Khmer and mathematics tutoring. This is designed to strengthen their skills alongside public schooling. It is essential support for 55% of them who do not receive any academic help at home. Every Sunday afternoon, we offer English classes. We also fund additional classes for the older students.
- **Professional integration:** Young people who wish to pursue vocational training can do so thanks to our partnership with the Buddhism for Social Development Action training center in Kampong Cham.



OUR ACTIVITIES

02. Kindergarten and after-school activities

Kindergarten and Primary School Care: a supportive and safe learning environment every day

KEPCHILDREN welcomes children on its premises from Monday to Friday in a safe environment adapted to their needs. Kindergarten children (ages 3–6) are cared for in the mornings, while primary school students (ages 6–12) attend the center in the afternoons.



These care sessions are provided in addition to the children's attendance at public school. During these half-days, the children take part in fun, educational, sporting, and creative activities. They also benefit from dedicated hygiene time (showers and tooth brushing), as well as meals and rest time for the kindergarten children.



This childcare is provided by Sotherera in the mornings and Piseth in the afternoons. Twice a week, the Civic Service volunteer works alongside the activity leaders to introduce new activities.



Since 2023, primary school students have had access to a library to further develop their reading skills. They spend at least 30 minutes there every day.

OUR ACTIVITIES

03. Social support

In alignment with our mission to promote education, we place local social support at the core of our activities. This approach is essential to addressing the needs of families and strengthening academic support for students.

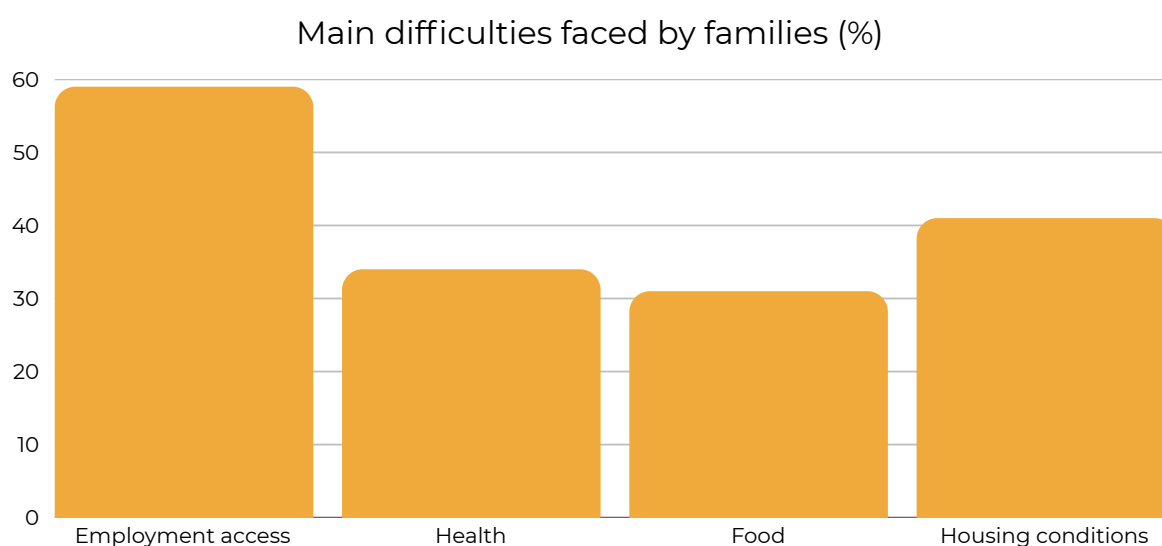
Annual social assessment:

Each year, the director conducts home visits with families in order to assess their needs. Using a structured questionnaire, we are able to calculate each household's income-based quotient, enabling us to better adapt and tailor the support provided

Monthly meetings:

Every month, the association organises both group and individual meetings with students' parents. These sessions aim to discuss any difficulties encountered and to collectively identify appropriate solutions. When needed, home visits are conducted to further enhance and individualise the support provided.

OUR ACTIVITIES

04. Food support

Before joining KEPCHILDREN, many children had to work to financially support their families, with schooling taking a secondary role. Our work consists in supporting families so that each child can attend school with a full stomach, without this resulting in any loss of income for their households.

Monthly rice distribution

Thus, each month, we provide food support by distributing up to 10 kg of rice per child, in order to encourage families to choose schooling. **In 2025, we distributed nearly 4 tons of rice.**

Une cantine pour tous

The KEPCHILDREN community canteen provides children with full, balanced meals. Kindergarten children attend every day from Monday to Friday, while primary school pupils receive two meals per week.

A healthy and varied diet is essential for children's well-being and their ability to concentrate in class. As a result, food assistance and the canteen represent one of KEPCHILDREN's main expenditure areas.



OUR ACTIVITIES

05. Healthcare coverage

In Cambodia, although the healthcare sector is developing, access to medical care remains limited for many families living in precarious conditions. KEPCHILDREN therefore places health at the heart of its support, in order to contribute to a better quality of life for children.

Financial support for healthcare costs

We cover the healthcare expenses of all our students, and sometimes those of certain families facing extreme hardship. Medical costs for students are fully covered.

Specialized medical care

Three students require specific annual treatment in specialized clinics in Phnom Penh and Takeo. KEPCHILDREN covers these treatments and supports families throughout the related administrative and logistical processes.

Dental health

Each year, we take students to the dentist through our partnership with the YourAid dental center, located 30 minutes from Kep. These visits allow for regular monitoring of their oral health and the provision of appropriate treatment when needed.

Access to hygiene

Many children do not have access to proper hygiene at home due to financial constraints and limited access to running water. At KEPCHILDREN, each child is provided with a toothbrush and toothpaste. Showers are also available on site.



OUR ACTIVITIES

06. School Transport

In order to make schooling accessible to as many children as possible and to ensure that transport is not a barrier, we cover the school transportation of young students.

Tuk-tuk

Our tuk-tuk driver, Mao, visits the homes of all kinderfarten children from Monday to Friday to bring them to the centre.

Bicycles

From Grade 1 onwards (equivalent to first grade), children are provided with one bicycle for every two students. This equipment is renewed every two years, and all repairs are covered by the association.

Support for motorcycle purchase

For older students attending secondary school, located 10 km from the Kep centre, we contribute to the purchase of their first motorcycle.

07. Housing support

The families we support live in highly precarious housing, most of which is made of corrugated metal. On a case-by-case basis, depending on their needs, families may receive financial assistance to carry out renovation or improvement works. This year, we also funded solar lighting for two teenage girls.



OUR ACTIVITIES

08. Social and cultural support

Throughout the year, we offer our students a variety of socio-cultural activities. We aim to broaden their horizons and provide them with enriching experiences that go beyond the school and family environment.

Educational workshops

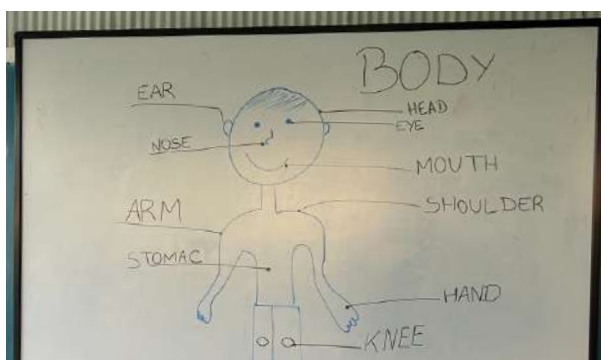
Once a month, students take part in awareness-raising workshops. This year, various topics have been covered, including screen use, nutrition, first aid, violence, and road safety. A health workshop on hygiene was also delivered by our partner Ucare Pharmacy for both children and their parents.

Physical activities

Every Sunday morning, students have the opportunity to attend boxing classes funded by our partner Sourires de Kep.

English classes

On Sunday afternoons, our teacher Moniroth runs English classes at two different levels, complementing the curriculum provided in public schools.



OUR ACTIVITIES

Movie nights

Each month, we organise a film screening in Khmer, accessible to all students.

Annual outing

Once a year, we organise an extracurricular trip for the children. This year, kindergarten students visited the Butterfly Farm in Kep, kindergarten and primary students went to the swimming pool, while older students visited the La Plantation pepper farm as well as the Secret Lake.



SUCCESSFUL DIGITAL CAMPAIGNS

SOUTENONS LA CANTINE DE



In September, we launched a crowdfunding campaign to ensure the long-term sustainability of our community canteen project. At the beginning of 2025, one of our partners discontinued its support, making it necessary to rely on collective generosity to maintain this essential initiative.

Conducted through the HelloAsso platform, the campaign exceeded our expectations. While our initial goal was to raise **€6,030** to cover the first six months of the year, a total of **€10,385 was ultimately collected**.

We would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to the **84 donors**, as well as to our partners **Chemins d'Angkor, Camp Outchea Original Project, and Challenge Cambodge** for their invaluable support. Special thanks also go to Camp Outchea Original Project and Pépé Bistrot for organizing a charity dinner in Phnom Penh.

The funds raised have now secured the project for almost the entire year and allow us to look toward 2026 with greater confidence. However, we are still seeking new partnerships to ensure the project's long-term future.

Currently, the KEPCHILDREN community canteen provides:

- Meals from Monday to Friday for preschool children;
- Two meals per week for older children.

Our long-term goal is to provide meals from Monday to Friday to all children supported by the association.

SUCCESSFUL DIGITAL CAMPAIGNS

“KEPCHILDREN’s Christmas 2025 Campaign”



This year, we renewed our “Christmas Campaign,” giving donors the opportunity to choose from a variety of gift kits to support KEPCHILDREN students during the holiday season.

The following gift kits were available:

- **“Dental Health” Kit:** Covers the cost of a dental consultation and provides children with oral hygiene products to encourage good dental care habits.
- **“School” Kit:** Provides all the essential school supplies for the 2025 academic year, including uniforms, school materials, and shoes.
- **“Rice” Kit:** Ensures the monthly distribution of 10 kilograms of rice throughout the year, helping to provide students with a basic food supply.
- **“Sponsorship” Kit:** Offers comprehensive support for a child’s education throughout the year, including school supplies, uniforms, shoes, transportation, and 10 kilograms of rice per month.

Thanks to this initiative, we raised a total of **€2,475**, corresponding to **49 gift kits sponsored**.

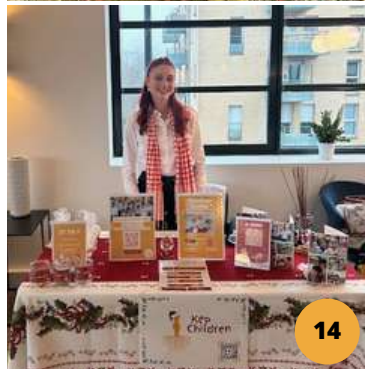
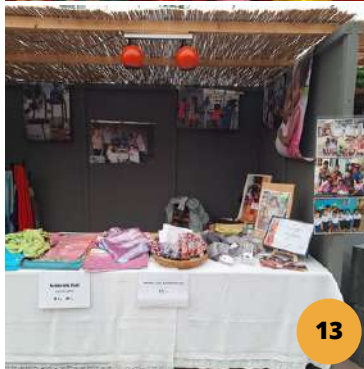
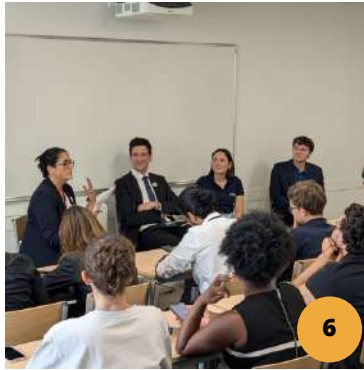

Coming in 2026...

Short term:

- Continue our actions and projects launched this year.
- Continue organizing extracurricular outings and dedicated activity days for the children.
- Ensure the sustainability of the project manager position in Kep through a local contract following the departure of Morgane Levasseur.
- Organize a football tournament with the Les Petits Bleus club in Phnom Penh.
- Set up weekly football training sessions.
- Repair the roof of the shelter and the center's toilets.

Long term:

- Strengthen and consolidate our funding base to ensure the long-term sustainability of our projects and programs.
- Develop and expand our partnerships.
- Help our teenagers find their path by introducing them to a range of professions and providing access to training opportunities.
- Continue supporting the schooling of our students for the current academic year and beyond, with the goal of finding a sponsor for each child to ensure their education in the long term.
- Raise the necessary funds to purchase land and build our own facilities in order to secure the future of KEPCHILDREN and move away from an unstable rental situation that requires relocation every 3 to 5 years. This will enable us to develop long-term projects for our organization. (Land cost: \$250,000).
